CONFERENCE

A conference is a meeting of people who "confer" about a topic. Conference is an event for researchers (not necessarily academics) to present and discuss their work. They tend to be short and concise, with a time span of about 10 to 30 minutes; presentations are usually followed by a discussion. The work may be bundled in written form as academic papers and published as the conference proceedings. Usually a conference will include keynote speakers (often, scholars of some standing, but sometimes individuals from outside academia). The keynote lecture is often longer, lasting sometimes up to an hour and a half, particularly if there are several keynote speakers on a panel. Panel discussions are intended to bring multiple perspectives on a topic. In addition to presentations, conferences also feature academic, parallel session and panel discussions, round tables on various issues, poster sessions and workshops.

- ❖ Authors' conference, or writers' conference, where writers gather to review their written works and suggest improvements
- ❖ Conference call, in telecommunications, a call with more than two participants at the same time
- ❖ Conference hall, room where conferences are held
- ❖ Convention (meeting), meeting of a, usually large, group of individuals and/or companies in a certain field
- ❖ Free conference, between the two houses of a bicameral legislature
- ❖ News conference, an announcement to the press (print, radio, television) with the expectation of questions, about the announced matter

- ❖ Parent-teacher conference, a meeting with a child's teacher to discuss grades and school performance
- ❖ Peace conference, a diplomatic meeting to end conflict
- ❖ Professional conference, a meeting of professionals in a given subject or profession dealing with related matters or developments
- ❖ Settlement conference, a meeting between the plaintiff and the respondent in lawsuit, wherein they try to settle their dispute without proceeding to trial
- ❖ Trade fair, or trade conference
- ❖ Unconference, or open space conference, who avoids meeting [with more persons], a participant-driven meeting that tries to avoid one or more aspects of a conventional conference

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE

Professional growth results not only from interaction and negotiation of meaning within the community but also from the effects of messages received from outside the communal context. A two factor model taking into account implementation and feedback is used to show the dynamic process of evaluation and negotiation in teacher educators'

professional development trajectory. This study deepens understanding of transition towards change within learning communities, while providing insight into the development of teacher educators as a distinct professional group.

Teacher education TE (TE) or teacher training refers to the policies, procedures, and provision designed to equip (prospective) teachers with the knowledge, attitudes, behaviors, and skills they require to perform their tasks effectively in the classroom, school, and wider community. The professionals who engage in training the prospective teachers are called teacher educators (or, in some contexts, teacher trainers).

There is a longstanding and ongoing debate about the most appropriate term to describe these activities. The term 'teacher training' (which may give the impression that the activity involves training staff to undertake relatively routine tasks) seems to be losing ground, at least in the U.S., to 'teacher education' (with its connotation of preparing staff for a professional role as a reflective practitioner). The two major components of teacher education are in-service teacher education and pre-service teacher education.

9. Collection of abstracts

An Abstract is a short document that is intended to capture the interest of a potential reader of one's paper. Thus in a sense it is a marketing document for one's full paper. If the Abstract is poorly written or if it is boring then it will not encourage a potential reader to spend the time reading one's work. Thus the first rule of Abstract writing is that it should engage the reader by telling him or what one's paper is about and why they should read it. Although strictly not part of one's Abstract, the title of the proposed paper is also important. Short attention-catching titles are the most effective. However, it is also important, for a conference paper, to ensure that the title describes the subject one is writing about. The abstract are written within 150- to 250-word paragraph that provides readers with a quick overview.

It should express one's thesis (or central idea) and one's key points.

it should also suggest any implications or applications of the research one discuss in the paper.

The function of an abstract is to describe, not to evaluate or defend, the paper.

The abstract should begin with a brief but precise statement of the problem or issue, followed by a description of the research method and design, the major findings, and the conclusions reached.

The abstract should contain the most important key words referring to method and content: these facilitate access to the abstract by computer search and enable a reader to decide whether to read the entire dissertation.

Our guideline for the abstract collection was:

Guidelines for conference paper

1. The conference papers should be original and published and adhering to the theme.

2. The cover page should have the title of the paper, the author's name, affiliation and contact Information.

3. for abstract 400 words with not more than 5 keywords.

4. Full paper 2000 words on 5/ 6 pages, size -12 Pt, abstract- 10PT title -16pt, authors name -14Pt, Times New Roman, 1.5 line spacing, justified, top and bottom, margin 1 and left and right margin 1.5 with dew reference(s) if any.

NB: The full paper will be published with ISBN number.

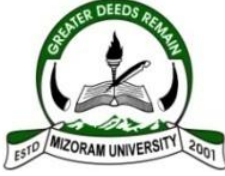


